### **Voters agree with Partnership Positions**

After reviewing the election day results the San Gabriel Valley Economic Partnership is pleased to say that all Proposition positions were backed by the voters. The Partnership took positions on six of the Propositions, of those six California voters agreed with the Partnership on all of them. The issues that were addressed in this election are important to the economy of the San Gabriel Valley and the state of California. Below are the Partnership positions and the final election results.

---

**Proposition 20-** Redistricting for Congress – **Support (Passed 61%)** *The voter-approved Citizens Redistricting Commission, instead of the Legislature, will be responsible for re-drawing Congressional districts.*

**Proposition 22-** Bans state from borrowing local funds – **Support (Passed 61%)** *The State government will not be able to take local government resources to balance the state budget.*

**Proposition 24-** Repeals corporate tax benefits – **Oppose (Failed 59%)** *If this was passed it would have cost California businesses \$1.4 billion in additional taxes, resulting in 144,000 job losses.*

**Proposition 25-** Majority vote for passing a budget – **Support (Passed 55%)** *The Legislature can approve a budget with a majority vote instead of a supermajority vote. This will increase their ability to pass a budget on time and the 2/3rds vote to pass any taxes should remain intact.*

**Proposition 26-** Two-thirds vote for approving fees – **Support (Passed 53%)** *Will broaden the definition of a tax to also include “fees”. This prevents taxes from being renamed as fees and passed with only a majority vote.*

**Proposition 27-** Eliminates redistricting commission – **Oppose (Failed 59%)** *If this was passed it would have reversed Proposition 11 and given the responsibility of drawing legislative district lines back to the Legislature.*
